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Resolution

adopted by the Human Rights Council on 14 November 2019

Human Rights Council,

Recognizing the rapid development of global medicine innovations,

Taking into consideration that human life must be respected and preserved,

Having considered the dangers of errors in diagnosis, treatment, aftercare or health management, surgical mistakes,

Stressing the importance of protection of the right of the principles of autonomy and self-determination,

1. *Recommends* states to create commissions of specialists on reviewing applications of patients on euthanasia;
2. *Urges* all member-state countries to guarantee high levels of treatment for those who are suffering from pain and discomfort in order to prevent an act of euthanasia by government guarantee's of psychological support for those in pain;
3. *Allows* the creation of an opened list of medically approved diseases (by WHO) by the following criteria:
 - i) That are currently stated as incurable and exceed the pain threshold;
 - ii) That are currently stated as incurable and have already reached the point of no return.
