Resolution 5 (2019)

Adopted by the Security Council at its 1st meeting on 14 November 2019

The Security Council,

Taking into consideration that acts, methods and practices of terrorism in all forms are aimed at the destruction of human rights, liberties, and democracy,

Noting with deep concern that terrorism can not and should not be associated with any religion, nationality or ethnic group,

Bearing in mind the need for elaborating a strategy to fight terrorism and ensure security in public space in a form of international dialogue,

Admitting the importance of extirpating the root causes of terrorism,

Believing fully to continue resolving the problem of terrorism, developing global prosperity, good governance and human rights,

- 1. Recommends creating an "International Air-marshal Organization" (IAO) to provide all member-states with the opportunity to make use from "Air-marshal" system and ensure the security of their flights;
- 2. Encourages setting up Education Vocational and Training centers to help people exposed to terrorism to come back on track and inform those who lack knowledge about hazards of terrorism of its sources and means;
- 3. Approves involving international financial institutions and regional organizations and initiatives within the limits of struggle against terrorism financing (SATF) to strengthen the economy and provide financial support by carrying out the analysis of the operating criminal legislation, administrative measures, and their realization in the countries with increased terroristic activity;
- 4. *Calls* to create a separate independent authorized court to deal with the sentencing of terrorists, the appointment of a measure and place of punishment, and the jurisdiction of national law enforcement;

- 5. *Urges* member-states to create specific legislation to define the judgment for using anonymizers, fast-flux hosting, double-flux hosting, and other techniques, which may assist the spreading of terroristic content as:
 - i) Incitement to commit terrorist acts,
 - ii) Creating explosive substances,
 - iii) Carrying out or calling for trainings on creating firearms;
- 6. Calls for further cooperation with the international community on a legislative level, by conducting further discussions and forums, and sharing the experience of diminishing terroristic activity on the Internet;
- 7. Requests member-states providing absolute protection of human rights, such as but not limited to freedom of expression and association, to investigate cases related to the manifestation of any forms of terrorism on the Internet:
- 8. Recommends conducting audit checks of the charitable organizations in the countries with increased terrorist activity to exclude the probability of financing of the extremist organizations;
- 9. *Encourages* collaboration with the General Assembly to organize programs such as the Youth Action Forum to enable an inclusive environment for youth and provide insight on national security issues and the solutions to them;
- 10. Further requests the global community to mobilize all the needed resources for counter-terrorism task forces to conduct operations in the sphere of financial crimes, money laundering, and financing of terrorism, and cooperate with the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) and United Nations Office of Counter-Terrorism (UNOCT) to aid Member States that lack financial capacity for such operations, by organizing:
 - i) Autonomous and independent FIUs to track illegal activities and ollection of all the financial data and further sharing of it,
 - ii) Monitoring current terrorism cases,
 - iii) Analysis of the threat prognoses and surveillance of cyberterrorist activities on the Internet:
- 11. *Urges* member-states to create a Special Forces unit on the governmental level to detect, identify and control dangerous substances, such as but not limited to chemical bombs and nuclear weapon;
- 12. *Recommends* encouraging the World Health Organization to strengthen its technical assistance of member-states to improve their public health systems and prevent biological attacks.
