Resolution 2 (2014)

Adopted by the Security Council at its 1st meeting, on
11 April 2014

The Security Council,

Reaffirming the commitment of all States to fulfil their obligations to promote universal respect for, and observance and protection of, all human rights and fundamental freedoms for all, in accordance with the Charter of the United Nations, other instruments relating to human rights and international law,

Affirming that the enhancement of international cooperation for the promotion and protection of all human rights should continue to be carried out in full conformity with the purposes and principles of the Charter and international law as set forth in Articles 1 and 2 of the Charter and, inter alia, with full respect for sovereignty, territorial integrity, political independence, the non-use of force or the threat of force in international relations and non-intervention in matters that are essentially within the domestic jurisdiction of any State,

Mindful of the determination proclaimed by the peoples of the world in the Charter of the United Nations to reaffirm faith in fundamental human rights, in the dignity and worth of the human person, in the equal rights of men and women and of nations large and small and to promote social progress and better standards of life in larger freedom,

Conscious of the need for the creation of conditions of stability and well-being and peaceful and friendly relations based on respect for the principles of equal rights and self-determination of all peoples, and of universal respect for, and observance of, human rights and fundamental freedoms for all without distinction as to race, sex, language or religion,

Recognizing the passionate yearning for freedom in all dependent peoples and the decisive role of such peoples in the attainment of their independence,

A ware of the increasing conflicts resulting from the denial of or impediments in the way of the freedom of such peoples, which constitute a serious threat to world peace,

Suggests to create special international Committee under UN supervision which will investigate the reasons of separation movement and then decide whether there are sufficient grounds for UN intervention,

Believes that it is vital for the global community to maintain the borders of sovereign nations and cooperate for the sake of peace and stability,

Promotes autonomy as the first step of establishing new geo-political entities in the disputed regions before creating completely separate states,

Proposes to create Separatist Movement ad hoc Committee consisting of SC member-states delegates, and representatives from the official government and the separatists movements, that shall decide how to deal with problems in question,

Suggests to send "fact finding missions" into the areas where separatism causes violence to gather information so that UN could react adequately to the problems caused by separatism.
