## **Resolution 2 (2015)**

## Adopted by the Security Council at its $2^{nd}$ meeting, on 10 April 2015

The Security Council,

Acting under Chapter VII of the Charter of the United Nations,

*Determining* that the situation in Yemen continues to cause calamitous breakdowns in law and order and constitute a threat to international peace and security,

*Reaffirming* its strong commitment to the unity, sovereignty, independence and territorial integrity of Yemen,

*Expressing* concern at the ongoing political, security, economic and humanitarian challenges in Yemen, including the ongoing violence,

Expressing urgency of the acts of violence committed by the Houthis and their supporters, which have undermined the political transition process in Yemen, and jeopardized the security, stability, sovereignty and unity of Yemen,

Welcoming the engagement of the Gulf Cooperation Council, and reaffirming the support of the Security Council for the GCC's efforts to resolve the political crisis in Yemen,

- 1. *Suggests* creating International Criminal Tribunal for Yemen in order to bring to responsibility those who have committed crimes against peace, and the commission under the auspices of which will undertake the investigation and after the end of the conflict will process the court procedure,
- 2. Calls for Organization of Islamic Cooperation to be a platform for negotiations between Yemeni legitimate authorities and rebel groups at the first step of the conflict resolution and with all other interested parties after the truce signing in order to establish the durable peace within the country,
- 3. Authorizes to expand the area and reinforce the activity of the Combined Maritime Forces acting in Maritime Security Patrol Area in the Gulf of Aden under the auspices of the UN,

- 4. *Invites* all member states to participate in the activities of the Combined Maritime Forces in order to curb any sign of illegal naval activity (piracy specifically) of all parties in the troubled region,
  - 5. *Decides* to remain actively seized of the matter.
