Resolution 1 (2018)

**Adopted by the Security Council at its 1st meeting
on 5 April 2018**

The Security Council,

Bearing in mind the work done by the OCHA and world community in terms of maintenance international humanitarian support,

Acknowledging the importance of support to the peoples and countries facing harsh conditions caused by armed conflicts and sanctions regimes,

Recognizing the necessity of providing the assistance to all those who are in need without discrimination and regardless religion, ethnicity and nationality,

Recalling the importance of cooperation for ensuring that those responsible for violations of human rights and international humanitarian law or complicit in attacks targeting the civilian population are held accountable,

Reaffirming that the United Nations should lead the effort of the international community in supporting the sanctions implemented countries aimed at establishing a democratic, independent and united community

1. *Asks* every sanctioned country accept humanitarian aid provided, and support the donor-governments and such as but not limited to OCHA exemptions clause in free access to government, civil society and internal military forces, that would stay neutral in humanitarian operations;

2. *Calls for* creating universal Exemptions Code that would regulate the positive freedom and the legal rules in accordance with agreed standards of international law;

3. *Recommends* UN member-states to work in the direction of preventing the collapse of negotiations with the sanctions implemented states;

4. *Urges* all Member States to reconsider each existing sanctions regimes according to the up-mentioned specifics;

5. *Calls upon* all countries to increase the voluntary contributions they provide to the United Nations specialized programmes, funds and agencies, most important among which are:

- The United Nations Central Emergency Relief Fund (CERF), managed by the United Nations Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (OCHA);
 - Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR);
 - The United Nations Children’s Fund (UNICEF);
 - United Nations Entity for Gender Equality and the Empowerment of Women (UN-Women);
6. *Encourages* UN states to recognize the right of the sanctions implemented states to establish types of permitted humanitarian aid;
 7. *Recommends* to centralize funding targeted at a specific country where the humanitarian aid is being provided by the supervision of specialized UN-bodies such as but not limited to Committee of Contributions, UN Population Fund and the UN Foundation;
 8. *Suggests* establishing risk-management framework within due-diligence measures in order to prevent abuse and monitor implemented mechanism within humanitarian aid.
