### **Resolution adopted by the Executive Committee of the United Nations High Commissioner on Refugees on 11 April 2019**

*Executive Committee of the United Nations High Commissioner on Refugees,*

*Desiring* to prevent the spread of further human rights violations,

*Seeking for* safety of refugees and reuniting their families,

*Taking into account* fundamental principles of sovereignty and non-interference into internal affairs,

*Concerned* that the situation in Honduras leads to human beings sufferings,

*Being fully aware of* international right of refugees and supremacy of justice,

*Calling* member states to join fight against corruption and any forums of economic crimes,

*Having considered* the efforts of the international community in peace keeping and maintaining of stability in the region,

*1. Proposes* to regulate the issue of illegal border crossing on the border between Guatemala and Honduras as well as between Mexico and Guatemala *by:*

- i) holding active search operations on finding and preventing routs of illegal traffic;
- ii) strengthening border control by attraction of additional human resources;
- iii) the tightening of procedures for checking the import of prohibited items;

*2. Calls for* the establishment of the procedures of identification and reuniting of the Republic of Honduras citizens whose family members are not located in the territory of the Republic of Honduras;

*3. Urges* qualified structures as UNHCR to take under control the refugee status identification procedures in countries of Northern Triangle;

*4. Calls for* establishing special migration camps for people applying for refugee status;

5. *Calls for* the UNHCR, UNHRC, IOM and other qualified international structures to create an expert commission on the Honduras issue in the question of human right violations which aims will be:

- i) Monitoring the current situation;
- ii) Providing local governments with the relevant recommendations.

6. *Recommends* offering the Government of Honduras a help in organization of the investigation on the current problem of corruption with the help of Transparency International;

7. *Proclaims* the need to increase the efficiency of police law enforcement units in order to avoid further usage of unnecessary violence from their side by calling upon UN state-members to provide Honduran police with specialists, capable of resolving such problems, regulating the work of specialists by the UN-supervised commission, the term "specialists" may be determined as a qualified person(s) in a particular field of study accredited by the UN-supervised commission to carry out a specialized UN mission for stabilizing of the situation.
