Adopted by the Security Council at its 1st meeting on April 11, 2019

The Security Council,

Recalling the provisions of Article 2, paragraph 7, of the Charter of the United Nations,

Being mindful of its duties and its responsibilities under the Charter of the United Nations for the maintenance of international peace and security,

Being deeply disturbed by the magnitude of the human suffering involved,

Taking note of the Resolution 688 of 5 April 1991,

Being gravely concerned by the repression of the Kurdish civilian population in many parts of the Middle East,

1. *Recommends* to hold Kurdish bilateral negotiations with individual countries in which the majority of the Kurdish people live,

2. *Orders* the Office of international Oversight Service to investigate the issue of genocide of Kurdish population that took place on the territory of Iraq, Iran, Turkey and Syria and if there are any manifestations would be detected thereafter to establish international criminal tribunal,

3. *Suggests* Turkey, Iraq, Iran and Syrian Arab Republic to carry out legal referendums –, where the constitutions and laws of the respective countries will govern the conditions and procedure of this referendum, on the issue of independence of Kurdish in the form of a state,

4. *Requests* to prohibit the violation acts by the countries of Middle East against the basic rights in accordance with the Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR, 1948) of the Kurds thereby ensuring the security and value of the safety of people living in the conflict areas,

5. *Calls on* Iraq, Iran, Turkey and Syrian Arab Republic to refrain from threats of violence and the use of force and as a way to deescalate by starting a constructive dialogue within the frameworks of negotiations on the territory of the impartial country,

6. *Recommends to* establish an operation with a UN mandate to get known in depth the Kurdish issue and determine the options for its solution only through diplomacy,

7. *Convicts* the repression of the citizens in Kurdish populated areas, the outcomes of which threaten international peace and security in the region,

8. *Urges* Iran, Turkey, Iraq and Syria to immediately provide the international humanitarian organizations with the access to assistance for Kurdish people.
