



Security Council

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Resolution 2 (2019)

**Adopted by the Security Council at its 2nd meeting
on April 12, 2019**

The Security Council,

Guided by the purposes and principles enshrined in the Charter of the United Nations,

Reaffirming its determination to further strengthen the role, capacity, effectiveness and efficiency of the United Nations system,

Reaffirming the respective role and authority of the General Assembly and the Security Council in the maintenance of international peace and security in accordance with the Charter,

Reaffirming the basic principles of United Nations peacekeeping,

Encouraging coherence, synergies and complementarities among the reform proposals for the peace and security pillar, management and the United Nations development system,

Commending the Secretary-General for his efforts to enhance the performance of the Secretariat's peace and security pillar,

1. *Urges* to strengthen the training of personnel:
 - i) to improve language preparation in order to simplify communication between peacekeepers and citizens and inside peacekeeping forces;
 - ii) to provide a proper education with computer systems, regarding the help of teachers, specialists and professionals in necessary spheres;
 - iii) organize specialized in-mission training, exercises and simulations to address identified performance issues;
 - iv) ensure maintenance of key contingent maintenance of key contingent/unit skills, and stress-test threat mitigation and crisis response measures;
2. *Calls on* to pay attention to international organizations to finance and improvement of the global cooperation on the international area in such ways but not limited to:
 - i) strengthening the living conditions for the peacekeepers;

- ii) providing the peacekeeping cantons with modernized and improved technologies;
- 3. *Invokes* to develop the Charter, concerning the responsibility of peacekeepers for violation against civilians during military actions;
- 4. *Suggests* analyzing with further update of strategic guidance documents and issue directives to the high-risk missions;
- 5. *Confirms* to develop a tracking system of priority commitment areas so that process can be systematically monitored by using the technologies of Department of Political Affairs;
- 6. *Suggests* leading regular verification against officials of the peacekeeping missions to prevent acts of corruptions by DPO;
- 7. *Suggests* the countries, on which territories the peace keeping operations are held, to repay 25% of the costs that are spent on organizing living conditions for the peacekeepers.
