Resolution 5 (2016)

Adopted by the Security Council at its 2nd meeting
on 21 October 2016

The Security Council,

Having examined the biggest influx of refugees in Europe since the World War II,

Noting with concern that the criminal threat has become more diffuse, with an increase, in various regions of the European Union,

Welcoming the humanitarian assistance to the refugees and facilitation of the different stages of the administrative processes required by the European Union for border control and asylum requests,

Pointing out the launch of a naval mission to crack down on the criminal networks smuggling migrants across the southern Mediterranean Sea,

Mindful of the need to support further efforts to strengthen European Union borders management,

1. *Invites* all United Nations member states to ratify the Convention Relating to the Status of Refugees and Protocol 1967 thereto;

2. *Calls for* putting under special monitor asylum-seekers with burned fingers and to send a request about the asylum-seeker to the other European Union member states to prevent multiple registrations;

3. *Calls upon* introduction of a unified biometric asylum-seeker and refugee identification database within the European Union;

4. *Urges to* provide refugees with a job as a source of legal income and in order to use their intellectual and labor potential for developing better living conditions of their stay;

5. *Proposes* to send the tax payments collected from working refugees to a specifically created Fund for the EU refugees and further use for the EU refugees' needs.
